Blucote Brigade II appeared in last year's Dog World Annual on Mrs. Titcomb's page as a 1½ month old puppy and was reserve winner at the U.S. Kerry Blue specialty at Westchester 1952 under judge David Mitchell. She was next shown at the U.S. Kerry specialty show at New York, the day before Westminster, where she was best puppy in show and winner of 5 points under Alva Rosenburg who predicted great things ahead for her. Next day, under Wm. Ross Proctor, she gained another 5 points at exactly a year old. She had another major win under Wm. L. Kendrick at Old Dominion, Virginia, and finished at 15 months of age with two bests of breed score specials, eight times shown. Her litter brother, Blucote Brigade's Ace, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Suzanne de Fournay, Washington, was winner four times in a row with a group placing.

Also pictured in last year's Dog World Annual was Mrs. Titcomb's now Ch. Kilday's Sally Blue, which finished with 19 points (and four reserves). Sally is the dam of Blucote's

Sally Faith who at the time of writing is 10 months old and has 16 points. Her litter brother, Blucote's Shamrock, owned by handler Don Dunmore, has won points and a best of breed with a group placing at the same age. Still another brother, Blucote's Boath of a Lad, shown six times, has been 1st in his class and twice reserve winner dog. One other litter male, Carnagel Cock Robin, has been shown once and won his class. There is a repeat breeding now at 3½ months in the kennel which looks even better. Everyone sympathized with Mrs. Titcomb this summer when she lost her beloved Ch. Blucote Brigade C.D. and Ch. Fandella Maith, both a great loss to the breed.

Mrs. Titcomb, who has bred twelve Champions, was elected a Governor of the U.S. Kerry Blue Terrier Club after serving as a Vice-President for eight years. She is also a Governor of the Kerry Blue Club of New England and Honorary Life Member of the Kerry Blue Terrier Club of England. She is a very popular winner and a great sport.—PHYLLIS HANSON.

Kerry Blue Terrier Family of Middleboro Move in Lofty International, TV Circles

MIDDLEBORO, May 1—Sugar is sort of a canine Mamma Gabor and like the mother at Hollywood loves her two kids, Eva and Magda, she, too, has a harem of glamorous offspring.

Latest of the Middleboro kerry blue terrier clan to steal the headlines, in true gladiator-girl style, is a cute little trick of a daughter called Pamela who recently celebrated her second anniversary as a television star. All in all, the blonde family of Flanders Farm here are quite the (one-colored) darlings and their courage and grace grins for the thrill of dog society national.

Prospered Lady

To introduce her formally, Sugar is Champion Blanche Cross of the Wags, a very prominent lady in kerry blue terrier circles and very much a part of a dog world aristocracy.

She was brought into the world by her good friend and constant companion, Mrs. Gladys S. Titchon, whose Blanche Kennel runs the same 13 acres on Cherry Street, off Route 26 here.

A veteran of show business herself, Sugar was not at all surprised when her daughter Pamela chose to make her career in television. In so many of the family have fitted in to the far corners of the world, she was especially pleased that her little girl chose to accept an offer close to home.

As an associate of Miss Olive Tinker's on a daily television program beamed from Providence, it was possible for Pam to get home for weekends and at least part of the family could be together to share a home case in a while.

Like any mother, Sugar was especially thrilled when Pamela's friend Miss Tinker surprised everyone by having an anniversary party for Pam right on the television program. It was really a very grand affair... anyone who was anyone was there. There was a big cake with two candles for a centenary and little individual cakes of the choicest ham-burger for each of the guests.

Unfortunately Sugar was indisposed that afternoon and couldn't share the big moment with her daughter, but she certainly couldn't let the occasion pass without an appropriate commemorative of some sort. According to Sugar, together with her friend Mrs. Titchon and Mrs. Titchon's business associate, Mrs. Margaret O'Neill, called on Miss Titchon, proprietor of a florist's shop. Together, they arranged to have a bouquet sent to Pam for delivery during the telecast of the party.

Pam was ecstatically moved when the beautiful floral piece was delivered and Miss Tinker read the accompanying card "Love, Gladys, Betty and Mother."

Shone Spotlight

Actually the party itself attending the telecast, "Ivory Mother" was the first time that anyone around here had that the star's parent was a radio of Middleboro. Living quietly in semi-retirement now, Sugar has always been used to stay away from the spotlight and leave show business to the children and younger members of the family.

Even when called on by The Standard-Times she insisted upon overlooking the commemoration aimed to her friends Mrs. Titchon and Mrs. O'Neill. Then, she insisted, since the real personalities.

As it turned out, Mrs. Titchon was really an old friend of the family. First acquaintance between Mrs. Titchon and the kerry blue was established about 30 years ago when a large street radio, ancestor left a 5th Avenue pet shop to live with the Middleboro breeder.

First of the family to win a national reputation is "Ivory" Bannock, with the help of Mrs. Titchon's guidance and patronage, was Champion Blanche of Gypsy and it is from her that the present Blanche line extends.

Won Championship

Since then, 12 more of the famous Blanche line have earned their championships and two have gone on to become international champions. Her association and work with the terriers has won national recognition for Mrs. Titchon who has been made an honorary life member of the United States Kerry Blue Terrier Club, and now holds the title of governor in that organization and a similar title in the New England club.

She has donated a perpetual trophy in competition for the best each year in England and served on a volunteer committee all over the world with breeders of the blue with whom she is constantly exchanging information.

Now is possibly compiling an extensive collection of data to be

used by Dr. E. S. Montgomery in the production of a new authoritative edition on the breed. The Blanche Kennels here are now operated in association with Mrs. O'Neill who is a veteran of some 30 years in breeding work and well known for her original work with some of the first bitches ever bred in America.

To get back to Sugar, Donald F. Smith, president of the U. S. Kerry Blue Club, writing in the Kerry Blue Handbook of 1948 says of her family that it has changed in the past half-century from "an aristocratic nation with no dog manners, who would fight in the ring and eat of the ring," to "a noble minded gentleman in blue, leaver, sweater in back and outdoor. The new breeders are somewhat higher on legs without wide noses and fronts."

The breed has the same dog and qualities that characterized it 40 years ago. Mr. Smith says—courage, stunner determination, common sense, friendliness, intelligence and personal self respect.

The constant companions of the kerry and helped the national dog of Ireland from whence the breed originated, the terriers have been companions to the great and near great of history for centuries.

Founded Family

Sugar's half-sister, whose impressive formal title is international Champion Blanche Durdine and who is known affectionately around the house as Betty, had the distinction of being sent to this to lead the Scotch across the line of the kerry blue family. Had to have a passport, health certificate and all the usual stuff like any other traveling celebrity, she, before it at all.

Mr. Titchon pays further tribute to the family in his handbook (referred saying they are "friends"), comparable, receptive and consistently close, an ideal companion for children, obedient of pushing, dignified and pulling. The kerry does not look for trouble, he adds, but is ready for it when it comes.

Mrs. Gladys S. Titchon of the Blanche Kennels, well-known kerry blue terrier breeder, is the breeder of the TV kerry Pam. Pam is a daughter of Blanche Sugar V. Peter, who is a daughter of Champion Blanche Cross of the Wags.

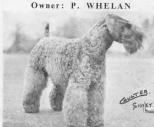

"DOG OF THE MONTH" FOR FEBRUARY

DOG OF THE MONTH for February, 1950, has been chosen, not for an outstanding show win record in 1949, as might be expected, because this Kerry Blue Terrier has been retired for the past two years. But perhaps this honor is due for other important reasons. Many breeders will tell you that the prize in their kennels they think the most of is not their latest champion, but their outstanding blood bitch, the producer of their champion.

Champion Kerrypatch Dare of Dandy from the Kerryland Kennels in North Hollywood, Calif., has proven herself to be one of the outstanding Kerry blood bitches in the country. "Bee Bee," as she is known to her many friends and admirers, has had her share of sensational wins in the show rings. The noted Chicago judge, Alex Stewart, selected her as Best in Show maternal at the Silver Bay Kennel Club event in San Diego. She had also picked up nine groups and

17 Best of Breeds out of 21 times shown in West, Midwest and Eastern competition.

We think this is a successful record for any cancer girl. But now she is at home playing a more domestic role, creating mischievous puppies, thereby rewarding the judges who had faith in her. The judge's job is to select the correct dog or bitch as so standard for stud or matron. Then, providing proper bloodlines or genetic principles are followed, perfection around the beltment of the breed is bound to be obtained.

Ch. Kerrypatch Dare of Dandy is doing her best toward improving the breed as it is upheld by the record of her get. She was sent to the court of Ch. Michael of Son-set, considered by Kerry fanciers to be one of the greatest sires of Kerry Blue Terriers in the world today. From this mating six pups were whelped, and at the age of six months, at the Los Angeles K.C. Show in April of 1948, four little sisters were one, two, three, four in a class of nine in the 6 to 9 months puppy class. They were Kerryland's Perfection, (see July & C cover) Perfect Peach, Miss Personality and Perfect Lady. Kerryland's Perfection became a champion 18 days later. Reeling for a year for a new blue coat, Perfection returned this spring to win the Terrier Group at the Beverly-Riviera K. C. Show in Santa Monica. Sent to the east, George Ward took her on a winning spree which included 7 out of 9 Best of Breeds.

Kerryland's Perfect Peach has finished and is admired for her fire in the ring and beautiful color. She recently won Best of Breed at Reno, Nev., over a former Best in Show dog. Her sister, Kerryland's Perfect Lady, is owned by Margot Jacobs of Enjay Kennels in Phoenix, Ariz. Mrs. Jacobs reports that Lady is headed for her championships. Miss Personality has 8 points and is well on her way to finish. The two males, Pride and Playboy, have finished and have been sold into disease nurseries where they are carrying on their sire's bloodlines.

THE KERRY BLUE



THE Kerry Blue Terrier originated in Ireland having been first noticed in the mountainous regions of the County Kerry, hence the name. They had been pure bred in this section for many years. Gentle, lovable and extremely intelligent, he is an allround working and utility terrier, used in Ireland and England for hunting all manner of small game and birds. Excellent retrievers, from both land and water. Are used quite successfully for herding sheep and cattle and are without a peer as a watchdog and companion for children. The Kerry first came into the public eye when they were adopted as The National Dog of the Irish Republic. The Kerry is endowed with a remarkable nose and has an instinctive trailing ability. He retrieves equally as well from water as from land and is tireless on the trail of his quarry. He has remarkable endurance and will fight unto death when in combat. The Kerry is adaptable to all manner of farm work, especially in the capacities of the average shepherd dog. He is a willing worker, is easily trained and enters into the spirit of his environs and his work in a whole-hearted manner. Game to the utmost degree, faithful to an unbelievable end, he is the most alert of all terriers. He has an instinctive air of watchful waiting and is quick to discern right from wrong. He is an indomitable foe, to wrong doers, and cannot be beaten as a watch dog and companion. In some instances he has been used in England for police work. Owing to their high degree of intelligence they are most easily trained for all the utility purposes for which they are used.

Height—Dogs about 18 inches at the shoulder, bitches slightly less.

Weight—Dogs about 33 to 38 pounds. Bitches 32 to 36 pounds.

Local Kerry Blue Kennels Produce Many Champion Dogs

Ch. Blucote Kilroy's Sally Blue, owned by Mrs. Gladys S. Titcomb of Firelog Farm, Middleboro, Sally is an ancestor for whom many dog fanciers would literally give thousands.

One day in 1936 Mrs. Gladys Titcomb, now of Firelog Farm on Cherry street, happened to go into a pet shop on Fifth avenue, New York. Some moments later she emerged into the daylight leading a large, off white dog.

Silver King, as she named him, was the first of many Kerry Blue Terriers she was to own. "He had all the faults," she recalls, "but he was a nice Irishman."

Facile or not, Silver King started her on the fascinating business of breeding and showing dogs. Neither Mrs. Titcomb nor the Kerry Blue Terriers has been the same since she entered this field. Six of the dogs she has purchased have become champions. Besides that she has bred 16 more champions in her "Blucote Kennel."

At the time Mrs. Titcomb was bred into these horses, but never so deeply as in show dogs. Her devotion to the Kerry Blue Terrier breed can only be described as fanatic. This seems to be a characteristic of Kerry fanciers, however.

The Kerry, while a show dog, can earn his way when food arises. As you can see from the pictures, he is a sturdy animal with a thick, curling coat of fur. He stands about 18 inches high and weighs between 30 and 40 pounds. Kerries have been used for hunting pheasant and quail, and at times even for duck retrieving. They can be trained to herd sheep or peacocks as a watch dog, and a Kerry, strange to say, will hunt down and destroy rats and other vermin.

Proponents of the breed claim that it is unusually versatile, adaptable to a wide variety of conditions, and a naturally clean animal. The Kerry combines qualities of loyalty and toughness with a playful, affectionate nature.

The breed originated in County Kerry, Ireland about a hundred years ago, having developed from earlier work and hunting terriers. Legend has it that the original blue strain came from a dog that was cast up from the sea when the great Spanish Armada was destroyed by Sir Francis Drake. But this is nothing more than a legend.

The Kerry was not shown as a breed until 1910 in Ireland, and until six years later in England and America. Its popularity has grown considerably since that beginning, but the Kerry is a long way from being in a class with Cocker Spaniels or Beagles.

For one thing, a good Kerry, like a good cigar, costs more than you would expect. Ch. Blucote Kilroy's Sally Blue, one of Mrs. Titcomb's prize females, is valued somewhere in the neighborhood of \$3,000.

Ch. Blucote Brocade II, another of Mrs. Titcomb's show winners. Brocade II is a prime example of beautiful configuration and alertness in a Kerry.

Sally Blue is especially valuable as she has produced a number of sons and daughters who have become show winners. Her kennel-mate, Ch. Blucote Brocade II, rated as the top female in the breed, is less valuable by about a thousand, since she has not been bred yet.

Blucote Kennel, under the guidance of Mrs. Titcomb and her associate Mrs. Marjorie O'Neill, has become in the course of the past 15 years one of the nation's leading producers of champion Kerry Blue Terrier show dogs.

The kennel is now breeding the sixth generation of a line that started in 1940. By a process of selective breeding and devoted care, Mrs. Titcomb and Mrs. O'Neill have been able to control the characteristics that appear. The bloodline is predictable. Blucote

dogs carry genes for desirable features, while the undesirable elements have been made recessive by the breeding process.

A judicious amount of inbreeding is necessary in order to achieve the desired points, but excessively close breeding has been avoided, as this produces a nervous, unstable dog. The Blucote line has been noted for its consistently good temperament as well as for its number of champions.

Foundation female of the present Blucote line was Ch. Blucote of Gorterry, who was purchased by Mrs. Titcomb in 1940. Blucote produced four champions herself. She was the grand dam of nine champions and the great grand dam of ten champions. Many more of her descendants are almost to

their titles. Blucote was 11 years old when she died in 1951.

The year 1943 marked the beginning of Mrs. Titcomb's serious interest in the breeding side of the kennel business. Prior to that she had been more concerned in the showing of her dogs. But in 1943 the name of the Blucote Kennel was registered with the American Kennel Society.

Today Mrs. Titcomb owns a dog regarded by some as one of the top Kerries in the world: Deeds Showoff, himself a champion, and sire of 27 champions. On the basis of the accomplishments of his progeny this dog was awarded the registration of merit, outclassing other dogs by hundreds of points.

Ch. Deeds Showoff, a world famous Kerry, who has sired 27 champions, among them the dog who is now used as the standard of the breed. Owner: Mrs. Titcomb.

Ch. Deeds Showoff has the further distinction of having sired the dog who is now used as the standard of the breed. Deeds' stud fee is understandably high, a cool \$100.

Another of the Blucote dogs, Ch. Blucote Brocade II, made a remarkable showing last year in dog shows throughout the United States. In 19 shows she won 11 best Kerry awards, four best opposite sex awards and one best female award.

Blucote Brocade, another famous champion, twice won best in show honors over all other breeds, a distinction in itself. One of these wins was when Deirdre took the \$1,000 Manning Memorial Challenge Trophy at the Montgomery Kennel Club in 1940. The daughter of Blucote, Deirdre went on to become an international champion.

When she was sent to Chile as the first American-bred dog to enter that country, Deirdre had to be accompanied by a visa, health certificate and other authentic documents, the name as a bazaar being. Her show record down there was excellent. Mrs. Titcomb preserved some of the accounts that appeared in the Spanish language newspapers of the American dog

The present population of the Blucote Kennel consists of the two female champions, one male champion, two unshown females who are still considered pups, and another male who is well on his way toward finishing his title. Just for variety, there are also one brown poodle and a Brussels Griffon. The Griffon, owned by Mrs. O'Neill, has a mummy's paw, and is a bright little fellow who never sits still. The Belgians used this breed for ratting.

Mrs. O'Neill has been interested in breeding dogs for the past 30 years. She was, for a long while, noted for her work with the boxer breed. Mrs. O'Neill has been associated with Blucote Kennel and Mrs. Titcomb since 1949, when the latter came here from Barrington, Connecticut.

Both women are devoted to the care of these dogs. When one litter required bottle feeding day and night for weeks, they took turns. Was it worth the lost sleep? They think so, for the litter produced a champion.

Kerry pups are born black, Mrs. Titcomb said. They go through intermediate stages of brownish coloration until, at about the age of 18 months their coats turn to some shade of blue. Mature Kerries range in color from steel blue to steel black. Their coats, when properly cared for, are lustrous and curling. Many Kerries do not look their best until they are three and a half years old.

One can find most remarkable things about these animals is that as thick as their coats are, they do not shed like other dogs.

Mrs. Titcomb's dogs retain the sporting character of the breed. Even now the approach of a deer at three or four in the morning is likely to send the kennel into an uproar. "The June issue of 'The Sportsman' will carry an article about the uses of Kerries in the realm of sports, Mrs. Titcomb said.

Firelog Farm, the home of the Blucote Kennel, is a treasure trove of Kerry lore. There are many volumes dealing with the history of the breed. Eight or nine scrapbooks on the show contain pictures of the dogs raised by Mrs. Titcomb and Mrs. O'Neill. Many of these dogs have been sold and have gone on to show fame under the handling of their new owners.

Trophies, cups, plaques and blue ribbons are scattered in profusion throughout the room, evidence of the many successful dogs raised in the past.

Mrs. Titcomb, the author of numerous articles for dog publications, has been a member of the breed for the past two years for a definitive book on the breed. Her correspondence has reached out to England, Ireland, Germany and South Africa.

For her work in improving the breed, The Kerry Blue Terrier Club of England made her a life member. A perpetual trophy for her name was established at the club.

She served for eight years as vice president of The United States Kerry Blue Terrier Club, and is now a governor of that organization. She is, so well, a governor of the New England Kerry Blue Terrier Club.

And all of this involvement with the Kerries began for Mrs. Titcomb 19 years ago with a large imperfect specimen she called Silver King. Since that time, although she insists, "We don't have a perfect dog," the Blucote has become synonymous with champion-ship show dogs everywhere the Kerry Blue Terriers are known.

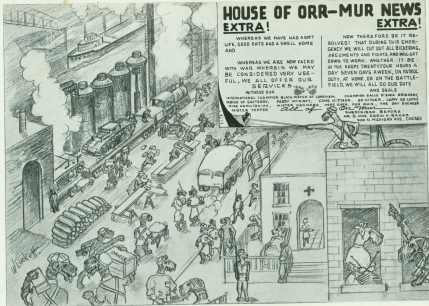

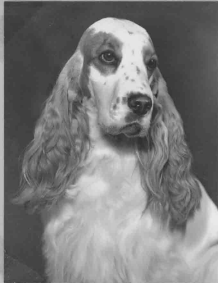
